Getting Back to Something like Normal

A part of me feels like I have been let out of prison! At least for a time. Having been fully vaccinated, and following the directions of the Center for Disease Control, I have been able to leave my mask in my pocket when going to a restaurant or shopping. I still need my mask when going into a doctor's office, or using public transportation, or entering worship on Sunday. The strict adherence to safety protocols has definitely been lessened. I am thankful.

Everyone in my family that can be vaccinated, has been vaccinated. This includes the grandchildren over the age of 12. My hope is that come fall, all school age children will be able to be vaccinated. I want them to be protected too.

I am not "middle of the road" when it comes to this issue. Color me un-American, but I sincerely believe that the safety of the community overrides the rights of the individual. I also feel that as a Christian, Jesus' call to "love thy neighbor," requires us to do our best to not bring harm to our neighbor.

Because, so many in the congregation have been vaccinated, we are lightening our policies about worship. We have removed the ropes that limited the pews that could be used on Sunday. If you are one who always had a favorite spot, you may return to that spot. We are not asking the ushers to seat us or dismiss us. We are opening all of our doors on Sunday for entering and exiting.

We are resuming the time of fellowship following the worship service. I've been told by a reliable source, that coffee is returning too!

If you are seated, and there are no children nearby, and you are vaccinated, you are free to lower your mask. When singing, we ask that you lift the mask back up, and also when walking around the sanctuary.

We will need to be flexible going forward. If the situation changes and the Center for Disease Control, or the governor's office makes new recommendations for our safety, we will make adjustments.

It is my prayer and my hope that this challenging season is mostly behind us. Too many lives have been lost, too many people have had their health impaired, too many tears have been shed. I look forward to "seeing the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." (Psalm 27:13)

HIGHLIGHTS from the ASBURY CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING on June 6, 2021

There are many great things going on at Asbury. Here are the highlights from our June 6th meeting:

- Chapel Service will begin July 4 at 8:15 a.m.
- You will receive your 2021 Stewardship Program letter from Pastor Laura in early September. Stewardship Sunday is October 17th.
- Church picnic date is planned for August 19th at Thompson Park.
- COVID changes continue. You may now seat yourself. All pews are open. Please sit 3 feet apart; masks only required as you enter & depart the church. Once you are seated you may remove your mask unless you are seated near children. Masks are still required if you are singing or around children. People may leave the service as they please after the Benediction.
- Vacation Bible School is planned for July 27-29 from 6-8pm each evening. Volunteers are needed.
- Trustees are seeking a bid to re-point the exterior stone work of the church. The roof edge of the church also needs to be painted. Starting November 1st, the rotunda area will be repainted.
- Membership & Evangelism Committee is assembling "welcome back" gift bags for teachers in several school districts and will distribute them this Fall. The congregation will be asked to contribute items over the Summer. A box will be placed in the Rotunda.
- To Promote Asbury, Bill Smith is setting up TV spots for Asbury during July & August. He is also planning a billboard display for October & November on the Screen in the Watertown Square.
- Nursery care needs to hire 2 adults to care for children, ages 1-5, during the 10:15 Sunday service. Interviews are planned.
- Starting July 10, Pastor Laura is hosting Saturday breakfasts at the parsonage during July and August to get to know more people. Please sign up on the board in the rotunda for a wonderful breakfast!

GREETINGS FROM THE TRUSTEES

Construction around Asbury is much quieter this summer than one year ago. We have our parking lot back, the roof work is finished, the painting and structural repairs in the attic and tower have been completed. Activity within the church is getting back to normal due to Covid vaccinations. We are now able to enjoy a much more normal 10:15 service and Chapel is resuming July 4 at 8:15.

Our bills for all work done to date are paid with no outstanding debt. I want to thank everyone who contributed to the success of our Capital Campaign. During the 3 year period (6/1/18)—5/31/21), our congregation and Asbury friends raised \$348,915! This is an amazing accomplishment.

Additional income came from a small balance that remained from a previous capital campaign fund, insurance money for our roof due to roof damage during a windstorm in April 2018, cashing in some CD's with the United Methodist Development fund, and major help, about \$400,000, from investments in the Asbury Endowment Fund. Costs of all work and projects to date total \$925,834. All bills have been paid.

As always there is some work still to be done. Finishing the interior painting and repairs will start about Nov. 1. There is re-pointing of some of the exterior cut stone and painting of the edge of the lower roof. Improvements need to be done in our sanctuary audio system.

The Trustees have discussed how we can plan to pay for the remaining work. The Capital Campaign ended 5/31/21 with a balance of \$27,414. The Trustees have decided to transfer the balance to a fund called the Capital Improvement Fund to help pay for the work remaining and future projects. No pledges will be requested. Anyone can contribute to this fund. Incoming donations need to be clearly marked Capital Improvement Fund. The Trustees also agreed that income from Invested Funds from the Asbury Endowment Fund may be used to complete these projects.

It is remarkable to think about all that has been accomplished to maintain Asbury for the future. It is also exciting to be able to look up and see how our roof, tower, and steeple are a beacon to the community.

The Trustees thank you for all your prayers and generosity.

NEW COMMITTEE IS FORMED


